#### Computer Science Supplementary Application Questions – 2024

##### Question 1: (Required)\*

Describe a situation you witnessed, or were involved in, where someone was treated unfairly or discriminated against. As you describe the situation, please outline how you responded, and would you do anything differently if that situation occurred again? If you have never encountered a situation like this before, please outline what you would do if this happened to you or to a third party. (120 words max.)

##### Question 2: (Required)\*

Briefly describe a personal goal you have set for yourself, and how long you have been working to achieve this goal. In your answer, please outline who you turned to for advice and/or help to achieve this goal, and what was their role? What did you learn about yourself? (120 words max.)

##### Question 3: (Required)\*

Describe an example of a situation where you took on a leadership role. Some examples include (but are not limited to): helping to resolve a dispute or contributing to a group's goal. In your example, please outline what your contributions were including your role and responsibilities. What did you learn from this experience? Would you do anything differently if you were in the same situation again? (120 words max.)

##### Question 4: (Required)\*

Describe a group, organization, or community you have been involved with.

What did you do and how long have you been involved? Describe the impact of your involvement in this community, and what you learned from being a member. (120 words max.)

## Question 1: Tell us about a passion or strong interest (required)

Tell us about a passion or strong interest of yours. How [and when] did you become involved in this interest [and for how long have you been involved]? ## Question 2: Community involvement

Briefly describe a group, organization, or community that you have been involved in, are a member of, and/or have contributed to. What contributions have you made as a member of this group? Were you able to lead, influence others and/or influence decisions for the good of the group and its goals? How has your involvement helped make this community better? (900-character limit)

## Question 3: Experience reflection

Describe a situation where you were treated unfairly or witnessed someone else being treated unfairly. What did you do at the time and why? Would you do anything differently if the same situation occurred today? Has this event impacted or changed who you are now and if so, how? (900-character limit)

## Question 4: Goals at Waterloo

What is your primary goal for attending the University of Waterloo? Have you explored, been exposed to, or have experience in the field you plan to pursue and if so, how? Did you turn to anyone for advice in exploring alternative options or backup plans for your goal and if so, how did this person help you? (900-character limit)

## Question 5: Outside of the Classroom

Please share what you are or have been involved in outside of your studies in the last 12 months -- in school, the community, or the home

## Question 6: Special achievements, distinctions, and awards
