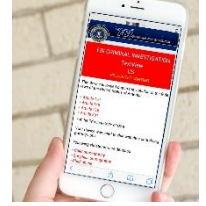

## FBI virus scares students!

Yesterday, on Monday May 24<sup>th</sup>, grade 12 students at Brampton Centennial Secondary School were studying for their physics test at a local Starbucks. While they were consulting the on-line textbook on their phones, a message popped up, reportedly from the FBI, and locked their phones.

“The pop-up was really scary,” said Deep Patel, one of the students whose phone was infected. “It said that they had found a copyright violation on my phone and that I owed them a fine of \$300.” Patel reported that the pop-up froze his iPhone and he was unable to exit his web browser.

The students had contracted the virus because they were using an unsecured Wi-Fi in the Starbucks. A hacker was using the WLAN signal to hijack the students’ phones. As seen in the photograph, the hackers froze the students’ browsers, preventing them from exiting the FBI virus pop-up.

One student, Eric Rivers, knew what to do. “I had read about iPhone viruses in my computer class,” he explained. “I knew that I should turn off the connection to my Wi-Fi, since it was probably unsecure.” Rivers explained that he also showed the other students how to clear out their browser history and get rid of the ransomware.

Unfortunately, police were unable to find the hacker on the Starbucks security cameras. It appears the cybercriminal was not even in the coffee shop. Still, the students felt they had learned a valuable lesson. Rivers reminds everyone: “Use unsecure Wi-Fi with caution. All phones are susceptible to viruses when they are connected to the internet.”
